Pentland site, off Squires Lane N3

to be redeveloped

Many will know the distinctive blue 1960s building, part of the Pentland group, just visible from the tube between Finchley Central and East Finchley stations and from Squires Lane. What is less obvious is that the buildings on the site surround a secluded landscape with a lake and mature trees. After many years as a local employer, Pentland have moved to offices in town, leaving behind a fascinating site whose future is now up for consideration.



The lake was first formed back in the 1830s to service the Market Garden and in particular Claigmar vineyard, famous for their black hamburg grapes. We understand the lake was fed by rainwater collected from the roofs of buildings and greenhouses. In the early 1900s the electricity board took over the site and set up a substation, making use of the lake water. A series of fires required the sinking of a 705 foot deep artesian well in 1911 to improve the water supply. The 'higher-than-

normal temperature of the water (in the lake) encouraged breeding and also the size of the fish'. The company built the blue panelled building in the 1960s and Pentland bought the building from the Electric Company in the 1980s. In 2004 they added a new, award-winning office building taking full advantage of the lake views with a link across the water to the main building.





Newsletters from the Finchley Society in 1990 (<u>here</u>) and from the Hendon and District Archaeology Society (HADAS) in 2024 (<u>here</u>) contain more detailed descriptions of the history of the site and members' stories.

Pentland have been contacting local groups and residents with a view to involving them in a codesign exercise to identify the best use for the site in the future. The Finchley Society, with others, was invited to a presentation on 21 May to mark the start of the process, followed by a tour of the site.
